Hypertufa is an artificial medium with properties similar to the tufa rock from which old stone sinks and animal troughs in England were carved. It is lighter than regular concrete, water permeable and weather resistant. It ages beautifully with a look of old rock. Different ingredients create unique textures that can be molded or sculpted.

Mosaics are the age-old art of creating home accent pieces or garden art using old dishes, tiles, marbles, jewelry, or glass. Students can create tables, trays, lamps, gazing balls, address plaques, mirrors, planters, plant stands, birdbaths ...UNIQUE garden art! Maybe a carousel horse or a pink flamingo?
